

CCTV PROJECT

As part of our business plan and as reported at our previous AGM held on the 6th November 2018, we mentioned having procured the services of Willem Scholtz in terms of getting CCTV coverage of the MMID. He has guided us through a process that, without his knowledge, would have been a maze of technical jargon and would not be at the point of installation.

To have gotten this far would also not have been possible without the assistance of CCT CCTV Officials to ensure compliance with CCT regulations in terms of their CCTV installation guidelines and policies.

There are currently 2 CCTV cameras in the district, installed and monitored by Star Rapid Response. One is at the corner of Koeberg Road and Montague Drive and the other is at the intersection of Freedom Way and Omuramba Road.

We have identified 27 sites for the first phase of the CCTV installation in the MMID area. This is in terms of the budget that we have for the CCTV project at this stage.

In doing so, the following sites were chosen considering that they are main intersections / locations and that we are not duplicating CCT CCTV infrastructure.

- Station Road (Thermal – Learner driver area)
- Koeberg Road and Ludel Road
- Link Road and Railway Road
- Platinum Crescent (SPICK AND SPAN)
- School Street and Koeberg Road
- Montague Drive & Marconi Road (BUCO)
- Montague Drive and Drill Road
- Montague Drive and Bosmansdam Road

We have already approached property owners to get permission to install the CCTV infrastructure on their property. Out of the proposed 27 sites we are only awaiting on 11 permission letters

We have also engaged with Supt Schuller and Chris Moller from the CCT CCTV Directorate Department to be compliant, which is meant to regulate not restrict, the erecting of CCTV infrastructure, also not just limited to connectivity and locations but that we follow the correct process in the event of installation being done on CCT property in terms of way leaves and that the CCT By-laws are adhered to, relating to CCTV advertising / signage.

We engaged with multiple integrators and monitoring companies for quotations as part of the RFP process. The board of Directors will be meeting at the end of this month to approve the integrator and monitoring companies for the CCTV project once the Surplus Funds for the project has been approved by the members present at the AGM

The purpose of this presentation is to stay within our business plan and commitment to the MMID by having CCTV coverage and therefore need the approval from the members present for the use of surplus funds to go ahead with the installation of the CCTV infrastructure.

CCTV MONITORING

The monitoring company will also be selected and approved, from the RFP process, at the next board meeting.

Even when a company has been contracted to do the monitoring, the server will be located at the MMID office with capabilities to view the cameras at any time, as well as view recorded footage from any of the cameras.

We will be making use of “black screen monitoring” at some sites during off peak hours, where the analytics will be specifically programmed to detect movement of either pedestrians / vehicles, depending on what is required for each camera location. This technology is for use during the night. These sites are still under consideration.
