The City of Cape Town is installing a new bulk sewerage line in Montague Gardens. Majority of the work will be done in Railway Road. The site office is currently being built on the corner of Link and Railway Road. This project

will be completed in 2025.

City Improvement Districts (CID) Forum meetings are held every three months. The purpose of the meeting is to share information, ideas, collaborations and find solutions to challenges CIDs are facing.



Watering Tips

- Plants absorb water through roots, not leaves, so you don't need to waste any water on leaves that appear to be dry.
- To tell how deep the water is penetrating the soil, use a stiff metal rod. Push it into the soil after you water and it will stop when it hits dry dirt.
- Use a thin layer of mulch to help your plants conserve water.

Irrigate garden with pure rainwater by <u>setting up rain barrels</u> near gutters and downspouts to collect runoff. Plants will thrive and it will reduce your water bill.
